Introduction of School-based Management

In part because school-based management is intended to enable schools to respond to local needs, it can vary greatly from school to school in three fundamental characteristics: the authority that has been delegated, the resources (inputs) devoted to implementation of SBM, and the stated objectives in introducing SBM.
